PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the District Court of the United States for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania:

The petition of Grikor Mirzoeff Sunny Suny respectfully sheweth:

First. My place of residence is 186 N. Dewey St. Philadelphia, Pa.

Second. My occupation is Musician (Give number and street)

Third. I was born on the 20th day of Jan uary, anno Domini 1876, at Pittsburg, Russia.

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Constantinople, Turkey on or about the 11th day of August, anno Domini 1883, and arrived in the United States, at the port of N.Y. on the 1st day of September, anno Domini 1883, on the vessel Braga.

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 23rd day of January, anno Domini 1894, at Philadelphia, N.Y., in the Supreme Court of New York County.

Sixth. I am married. My (wife's) name is N. H. W. Hart (she) was born on the 2nd day of December, anno Domini 1877, at Russia and now resides at with me, Pennsylvania.

I have 8 children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government, nor a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to The State of Russia, of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 1st day of September, anno Domini 1883, and in the State of Pennsylvania, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 1st day of April, anno Domini 1894, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I made petition for citizenship to the _____ Court of _____ at _____ on the _____ day of _____, anno Domini 18____, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit, _____, and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.)

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
